TRAIL NEWS & TRAIL MAINTENANCE

Like in previous years, 2023 saw several projects completed by work parties arranged by the trail maintenance and development volunteers. In March of this year a 50' boardwalk was developed on a very wet section of the Chris Hatfield trail in Ruckle Provincial Park. Later in the spring several volunteers replaced 27 trail signs in Burgoyne and Maxwell Provincial Parks. In the summer a very successful day was held removing broom in Ruckle Provincial Park. In October several volunteers rerouted a section of the Merganser Pond trail where sink holes had developed. The old section was closed off and the new section a little higher up the hill now provides a safe route away from the sinkholes. One project we still hope to tackle this year is a reroute of the steep, and often slippery, trail section just before the bridge on the Chris Hatfield trail. We are awaiting approval from BC Parks to do that. Earlier this year a grant had been applied for (and was approved) for the development of new, updated trail signs in Ruckle now that the Yeo Point extension trail and the Chris Hatfield trail have become official trails within Ruckle Provincial Park. We'll need a crew to replace a large number of updated trail signs next spring.

Having access to trails is of the utmost importance to all members of our club. Hiking on clear trails without obstructions or dangerous branches is vital. Trails need to be maintained through the year. All members have a chance to indicate their willingness to help with this ongoing chore. VOLUNTEERING


