May Events

Sunday, May 4th

Hike – UPDATE Meet at Art Spring to car pool departing at 1:00 or at the top of Broadwell to set out at 1:15. We will follow the west boundary of Channel ridge and then return on the ridgeline.

Tuesday, May 6th

Hike – Lynn Thompson will lead a hike on Mt Tzouhalem to see the wildflowers. Meet at Portlock Park to consolidate vehicles before proceeding to Vesuvius for the 9:35 ferry, leaving Portlock at 8:45. If anyone requires a pickup from Art Spring, I will be there at 8:35. Drive to the Kaspa Road trailhead (map will be posted nearer to the date).

Tuesday, May 6th

WALK – Barb Baldwinson will lead an easy walk on quiet roads and small trails from St Mary Lake public access parking along LePage to Whims Rd and on to Fernwood Beach. Lunch and beach combing on Fernwood Beach. The tide will be falling. Note that the coffee shop is not currently open on Tuesdays.

Here's a little more information on the upcoming broom pull, plus a clarification on start time and parking, from what was originally communicated.

In a break from tradition (usually, we pull broom at Ruckle or Burgoyne), we'll be tackling a new location: the Howard Horel Nature Reserve. Howard Horel is a beautiful reserve and when it was acquired by the Salt Spring Conservancy in 2018, it contained extensive broom stands. Over the years, the Conservancy has spent countless hours clearing the broom, mostly the work of Kees Ruurs, Warden of Howard Horel, a TNC member and formerly Trail Coordinator of the TNC. It takes a few repeat visits to get broom under control and this month's visit by the TNC should really help out.

Where to meet on Tuesday, May 20:

Meet at the parking area near the end of Mereside Rd at 10:00.

Carpoolers leave from ArtSpring at 9:40.

If necessary, we can double park in the parking area, which should hold 8-10 cars, with 3 more on the road.

What's the plan for the day

We'll walk as a group from the cars to Howard Horel, approx 10-15 minutes. Kees will give an overview of the best way to cut the broom and pull it out, and when it's best to cut and when to pull. Unlike Ruckle, there will be no bin for disposal (so no long hauls of giant tarp loads of broom) and Kees will show us how to dispose of the broom in a nearby shaded area. We'll be tackling three separate areas within the Reserve, so we'll split into three groups and Kees, Bill Palmer and Larry McIntyre will each lead a group to one of these areas.

At 12:30 we'll all meet back at the entrance to Howard Horel, have some lunch, then head back to the cars.

What to bring:

Bring gloves, clippers, loppers or a folding saw, lunch and a drink. **What about rain?** If the weather's bad, we'll reschedule and send out a cancellation email.
